(Details of Schemes for the information of General Public)

ADI DRAVIDAR AND TRIBAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT

INTRODUCTION:

According to 2011 Census, out of the total population of 721.47 lakhs, in Tamil Nadu, the population of Adi Dravidars is 144.38 lakhs and Tribal population is 7.95 lakhs. Therefore the Adi Dravidars constitute 20.01% and Tribals constitute 1.10% of the total population in Tamil Nadu. The majority of the Adi Dravidars / Tribal population are economically backward and socially marginalised. Most of the families lack resources and access to education, employment and other income-earning opportunities are limited.

According to 2011 Population Census the literacy percentage of Adi Dravidar / Tribal people are as follows:-

2. Welfare Programmes:

The Government of Tamil Nadu implements several welfare programmes for the socio-economic and educational development of the Adi Dravidars and Tribals in the State. The objective of these programmes is to facilitate faster socio-economic and educational development of the Adi Dravidars / Tribals so as to end their social seclusion and economic deprivation and also to speed up the process of integrating them with the national main stream. All the 20 sectoral departments constituting of 44 HOD's for SCs and 17 sectoral departments constituting of 38 HOD's for STs, earmark specific allocations for the benefit of the Adi Dravidars / Tribals from their regular planned programmes allocations.

Among various social sector programmes implemented by the Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department, education occupies the prime place as it reforms the society at greater level. Besides this, various other welfare programmes like distribution of house site pattas and construction of houses and provision of basic amenities like roads, street lights, supply of drinking water, burial ground and pathway to burial ground etc. are also taken up as part of the social development programmes.

Construction of traditional houses, distribution of milch animals, provision of drinking water facilities and street lights are the benefits extended to the **Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups** for those who are residing at hilly areas.

60% financial assistance is also given to start any viable income generating activities and 30% for creating infrastructure facilities for these income generating schemes under **Special Central Assistance to Tribal Sub Plan** to be implemented in Tribal areas.

In order to provide infrastructure facilities in Tribal areas and also to implement the Forest Rights Act, necessary funds are provided under Article 275 (1) of Constitution of India.

Tamil Nadu Adi Dravidar Housing Development Corporation (TAHDCO) implements these economic development programmes in addition to the regular economic development programmes implemented by various sectoral departments for the benefit of the Adi Dravidars / Tribals / Adi Dravidar Converted to Christianity in the State. The economic development programmes implemented through TAHDCO are primarily of three categories namely 1) Micro enterprises development for the poor families 2) Vocational job-oriented skill training programmes and 3) Individual entrepreneur schemes which are supported by appropriate training and subsidy programmes. To create employment opportunities and to strengthen the skill needs specific trades among the youths, suitable

skill development training programmes are organised through well known and recognized institutions.

3. Administrative Machinery:

At the Government level, Directorate of Adi Dravidar Welfare and Directorate of Tribal Welfare and TAHDCO, an exclusive Corporation constituted for promoting economic development of Adi Dravidar / Tribal, are functioning under the control of Additional Chief Secretary, Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department. At the State level, the Directorate of Adi Dravidar Welfare is headed by an I.A.S., officer. Similarly the Directorate of Tribal Welfare of the Adi Dravidar and Tribal are working with their supporting staff for the Welfare of the Adi Dravidars and the Tribals. TAHDCO as a Corporation is responsible for implementing all the economic development programmes for the benefit of the Adi Dravidars . It is headed by the Managing Director in the cadre of an IAS officer. In the field level, TAHDCO has district offices headed by District Managers.

Collectors at the district level are the main co-ordinating officers for monitoring all welfare programmes for the benefit of the Adi Dravidars and Tribal people with the support of District Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Officer, District Manager, TAHDCO and the heads of the Sectoral Departments like Rural Development and Panchayat Raj, Agriculture, Health and Family Welfare, Higher Education, Animal Husbandry, Dairying & Fisheries, Municipal Administration & Water Supply, Revenue, School and Social Welfare & Nutritious Meal Departments etc. involve themselves in implementing "Schedule Castes Sub Plan" for Adi Dravidar and Tribals

4. Schools and Hostels

The following provisions are given to the students belonging to SC / ST studying in Adi Dravidar welfare and Government Tribal Residential Schools.

Concessions given to students studying in Adi Dravidar Welfare Schools:-

In order to encourage the students and to reduce dropouts in schools, Polytechnic and college and to continue their studies, hostel facilities are provided to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes those who are residing in village areas. Facilities provided to the students staying in Hostels:-

- > Two Tier cots are provided to College Hostels
- > Incinerator (Napkin Burners) are provided to 582 Girls Hostels
- Water purifiers, Wet Grinders and Colour Televisions are provided to all hostels
- > Washing Machines are provided to 76 Adi Dravidar Welfare Girls Hostels.
- Steam Boilers for cooking hygienic food are provided to 380 Adi Dravidar Welfare Hostels and 160 Government Tribal Residential Schools.
- First Aid Boxes are provided to all hostels
- > Library facilities are made available in all Adi Dravidar Welfare Hostels.
- Mats and Bed Sheets are supplied to the Hostellers.
- Rs.50/- per student per month for School Hostels and Rs.75/- per student per month for College, ITI and Polytechnic College is given for purchase of Soap and Oil etc as Miscellaneous Charges. Money has been credited in the students Bank Account.
- Food charges of Rs.900/- per month for school students and Rs.1000/- per month for College Students are provided.

5. Admission of Students belonging in VI Std in Reputed Residential Schools and admission in Reputed Schools for Boys / Girls who score the highest marks in X Std.

The bright students studying in 5th Standard are admitted in the reputed residential schools in 6th standard and the entire expenditure of these students are borne by the Government till 12th Standard. Under this scheme, one girl or one boy who secures the highest mark in the special examination conducted in each Block is admitted in Reputed Residential Schools.

With a view to help the Adi Dravidar and Tribal students to appear for the All India Level Competitive Examinations and to improve their skills, 10 outstanding students (including 3 girl students) from each district, totalling 320 students who secure the highest marks in X std are selected and admitted in the XI std. in Reputed Private Schools. A sum of Rs.28.000/- per student is being spent by the Government every year.

6. Education (a) Scholarship

Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department is implementing various educational scholarship Schemes from 1st Std to PG & Ph.D degree with the prime objective of providing quality education to Socially and Economically backward SC, ST and SCC people to ensure socio-economic, educational development, social dignity and self sustainability.

Some schemes are being implemented, with a social vision and without any reference to the castes, depending on the profession of them. Further, many schemes are being implemented taking into account the communal and income limits, with the object of enhancing specific communities and social development at large.

A cash award is given to the best Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Scheduled caste converted to Christianity students those who scored 60% and above marks in Under Graduate, Post Graduate and Professional Courses examination.

To support avenues for creativity of expressions in the field of Art, Culture, Literature and research activities of Scheduled Caste scholars, a Corpus Fund of Rs.50.00 lakh has been created and kept in fixed deposit. 10 writers who belong to Adi Dravidar / Tribal / Adi Dravidar converted to Christianity and one non-Adi Dravidar writer are awarded every year for the best literary work and an amount of Rs.40,000 is given by the Government for publishing their work

7. SPECIAL INCENTIVE SCHEME FOR GIRL STUDENTS.

To reduce the dropouts and to increase Enrollment of the Adi Dravidar and Tribal girl students and to help them to continue their studies in III to V and VI standard, they are givenRs.50/- per month and Rs.100/- per month as an incentive for 10 months in a year. This scheme is being implemented in all the districts. From 2013-2014 academic year it has been extended to the Girl students who are studying in VII & VIII Standard and they are given Rs.150/- per month as incentive for 10 months in a year.

8. REMOVAL OF UNTOUCHABILITY

The Scheduled castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act 1989 and the Scheduled castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Rules 1995 have been amended by the Government of India after getting concurrence from the State Governments as Scheduled castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) (Amendments) Act 2015 and Scheduled castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Amendment Rules 2016. The above said Act and Rules have been notified in the Gazette of India Extraordinary and came into force on 01.01.2016 and 14.04.2016 respectively.

Similarly one village in each district (except Chennai) is selected for the assistance where untouchability is not practiced in any form and the people live in harmony. A sum of Rs.10.00 lakh is given to the selected village.

9. Provision of basic amenities to Adi Dravidars and tribals

Free house site pattas are issued to the houseless Adi Dravidar and Tribal families. Supply of protected drinking water to the Adi Dravidar and Tribal habitations is one of the schemes which is given priority under infrastructure development. Wells and Bore wells are being provided instead of ordinary open wells. Further, Government is allocating funds for providing burial grounds and pathways to burial grounds in Adi Dravidar habitations. To cater to the need of Adi Dravidar for the purpose of conducting marriages, social functions, meetings etc., community halls are also under construction.

II. TRIBAL WELFARE

Introduction

The Directorate of Tribal Welfare was bifurcated from Director of Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department with effect from 01.04.2000. The Government of Tamil Nadu is paying special attention for the development of tribal people in 18 Districts where Scheduled Tribes concentration is more. The prime objective of the Government is overall improvement of Education, Health and Socio Economic status of tribes and to reduce the gap between tribes and non tribes. Basic needs like provision of drinking water, link roads to the tribal villages, construction of houses and other infrastructural requirements are given special focus.

In Tamilnadu, **Tribal Sub Plan** has been implemented since **1976-1977**. It is a part of State's annual plan and constitutes about 1.1% of the annual plan in proportion with the population of scheduled tribes in the State. Under Tribal Sub Plan, all the departments allocates funds to implement schemes for tribal welfare, infrastructure improvement of tribal areas, and to create livelihood opportunity for tribals. Tribal Sub Plan ensure that resources spent for the benefit of scheduled tribes is atleast in proportion to their population.

Under **Special Central Assistance to Tribal Sub Plan** (**SCA TO TSP**) 60% of the funds are utilized for income generating activities and 30 % of funds are utilized for infrastructure facilities and remaining 10% of funds are utilized for creating employment opportunities for tribal people in the 10 I.T.D.P. areas covering 7 Districts Viz., Salem (Yercaud, Pachamalai, Aranuthumalai and Kalrayan Hills), Namakkal, (Kolli Hills), Villupuram (Kalrayan Hills), Tiruvannamalai (Jawadhu Hills), Tiruchirapalli (Pachamalai Hills), Dharmapuri (Sittheri Hills) and Vellore (Jawadhu and Yelagiri hills) where Tribal population is 50% or more than the total population.

Inorder to Provide infrastructure facilities in Tribal areas, maintenance of Tribal Residential Schools, necessary funds have been provided under Article 275 (1) of the Constitution of India.

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Out of the 36 Tribal communities in Tamilnadu, 6 Tribal Communities i.e. Toda, Kota, Kurumbas, Irular, Paniyan and Kattunayakan are declared as **Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs).** Government is focusing more on the social, economic and education development of the six tribal groups through PVTG Scheme. Construction of traditional houses, Schools, Brick kiln, distribution of milch animals, provision of drinking water facilities, street lights, supply of Beehives, Vehicles, Fishing Nets, Two Wheelers, Providing Bore wells etc., are some of the welfare oriented works done under the scheme.

Under **Comprehensive Tribal Development Programme**, Land development activities, improvement of Katcha houses, construction of Community Halls, road work, improvement of infrastructure in GTR schools, provision of drinking water facilities, free 3 Phase Electricity connections, economic development schemes and training skills are implemented.

Tribal Research Centre (TRC) was established in the year 1983 with the assistance of Government of India at Muthorai Palada, Udhagamandalam in the Nilgiris District, for data collection about the Tribes and to conduct necessary research about their life style, culture, language and socio economic and educational status. A Director, who is specialized in Anthropology is heading TRC. A Library and a Tribal Museum has been setup in which the tribal artifacts and photographs on the life style of the tribes are displayed.

III. TAMIL NADU ADI DRAVIDAR HOUSING DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION (TAHDCO)

Tamil Nadu Adi Dravidar Housing and Development Corporation (TAHDCO) was commissioned in 1974 under the Companies Act, 1956 initially as a construction company for construction of fire proof houses for the people of Scheduled Caste. Since1980-81, the Corporation has also been involved in socio economic development activities for the benefit of Adi Dravidar people. The approach of the Government is two pronged viz, strengthening the infrastructure, particularly on education and basic amenities which are directly benefiting the SC/STs at large.

Simultaneously efforts are made to implement various welfare programmes and economic development programmes to ensure sustainable social and economic development among the Adi Dravidars and Tribals.

- 1. at first to strengthen and improve the quality of infrastructure in Adi Dravidar / Tribal habitations, schools and hostels run for the benefit of Adi Dravidar/ Tribal. Schools and hostels will be provided with buildings, water supply, sanitation facilities etc.
- Secondly special drive will be organised on improving the livelihood opportunities of poor through self employment and skill training with special focus on bonded labourers, scavengers and those Adi Dravidar/ Tribal families living below poverty line.
- 3. Thirdly, programmes for the development of entrepreneurs among the Adi Dravidar / Tribal will also get priority

Economic Development Schemes (A) FOR ADI DRAVIDARS

In the year 2004-05 an exclusive scheme for women named Land Purchase Scheme was introduced for empowering them and also to improve the size of land holding of this community

The benefit under this scheme is extended to all the land owners of Adi Dravidar community and was named as **Land Development Scheme**. The aim of the scheme is to

create water resources and irrigation facilities and thereby enhance the land utilisation as well as income through lands.

In order to reduce the poverty reduction by assisting the Adi Dravidar people in the age group between 18 to 55 years irrespective of their educational qualification which is accessed by both individuals and groups under **Entrepreneur Development Programme scheme**

Un-employed youth in the age group between 18-35, who desire to establish their own profession or business enterprises can be accessed under **Self Employment Programme for Youth**

Adi Dravidar women self help groups are provided with **Revolving Fund** Assistance for poverty eradication.

For income generating programme, maximum of 50% of the project cost or Rs.2.50 lakh whichever is less is sanctioned as subsidy as **Economic Assistance to Self Help Groups.**

A sum of Rs. 20,000/- is granted for differently abled, destitute widows, indigent artists, unmarried women above 40 years of age and children with no parent / guardian and any other person who is considered as deserved for grant by the District Collector under the Scheme **Collectors Discretionary Fund**

Rs.100.00 lakh is allocated to extend financial assistance for medical treatment, gap filling assistance to those who pursue primary education to professional courses and persons affected in communal clashes and any other activities which deserve a helping hand subject to rules in vogue under the **Managing Director's Discretionary Fund.**

To support the Civil Services aspirants belonging to Adi Dravidar communities **Financial assistance** of Rs.50,000/- is given to those who have passed **Civil Services** (Preliminary) Examination to enable them to prepare for Civil Services (Main) Examination from 2012-13 onwards.

Financial Assistance of Rs 50,000/- is available to the successful **law graduates**, from Tamil Nadu law University, Deemed Universities and the law colleges recognized by the university on regular curriculum for setting up their profession. The eligibility criteria is

the applicant should be above 25 and not above 45 years, regular legal practitioners, registered in the State or All India Bar Council are given one time assistance.

Financial Assistance of Rs.50,000 is provided for those who are in pursuit of **Group I Services**.

To encourage the young Chartered Accountant / Cost Accountant to set up own profession a grant of Rs.50,000/- is provided to setup their profession

In accordance with the Hon'ble Chief Minister's announcement, women members of the Industrial Tailoring Co-operative Societies under the control of Directorate of Social Welfare, beneficiaries were given assistance for the purchase of modernized sewing machine. Each beneficiary is given 30% of the cost of the sewing machine as subsidy from Special Central Assistance (SCA) and the balance 70% is given as soft loan at 4% interest from TAHDCO's share capital. To create employment opportunities and to strengthen the skill needs specific to trades among the youths belong to Adi Dravidar, Tribe and Adi Dravidar converted to Christianity, suitable skill development training programmes are organized through Tamil Nadu Skill Development Corporation empanelled institutes.

Since, the Employment Opportunities are more for Driver of Heavy Vehicles, Training on Driving are given by the Institute of Road Transport, Ashok Leyland and TVS to the Scheduled Castes and Converted Christian Students.
